

## Scottish Gaelic National Spring School

In 2010, we will conduct another national Gaelic school following on from our successful inaugural event last year.

Comunn Gàidhlig Astràilia in conjunction with Gaelic Society of Victoria are again supported by the Gaelic Society of WA, Coisir Ghàidhlig Astràilianach, Brisbane Gaels, Southerly Gaels, Eilean Mor and the ACT, South Australian and Tasmanian learner groups.

The Sgoil-Earraich Nàiseanta (Scottish Gaelic National Spring School) will be held at the School of Music, Australian National University, Canberra, from Friday evening 10 September to Sunday afternoon 12 September 2010.

### Familiar format for learning

This Sgoil will follow the tried and tested formula that we've applied over the years, with an emphasis on practical spoken Gaelic. We will be led by experienced language teachers including native speakers and fully fluent learners of the language. This year we will have a visiting young tutor from the Hebrides to assist us.

### Classes at your own level

As in previous years, each person attending the Sgoil will be assigned to an appropriate class according to his or her level of fluency. Classes will cover the spectrum of skills – reading, writing, conversation and comprehension, from complete beginners up to the advanced class conducted 's a' Ghàidhlig for those who are fluent or advanced learners.

### Teaching through the medium of song

This Sgoil will provide a unique teaching approach with the use of Gaelic song to introduce learners to the sounds and rhythms of Gaelic. Classes will be led by an experienced Gaelic singer and facilitator who has competed at the highest level in Gaelic singing.

## Immerse yourself in Gaelic

Making the most of the residential format, there will be constant opportunities for using Gaelic in your daily activities – meals, chores, washing etc. The Sgoil leaders will facilitate this with word guides and useful phrases provided for your use. We hope that you'll go away with language that you can use in your daily lives long after the Sgoil has ended.

### Extra activities

Outside of class times, and especially in the evenings, there will be opportunities to socialise and learn more about Gaelic while enjoying music, poetry and culture. Evenings include activities such as a ceilidh featuring visiting and local musical groups, or a trivia quiz with a Gaelic theme.

### Bring your instruments

All participants are encouraged to take a turn at the traditional ceilidh, so bring your musical instruments, favourite songs or poems, or dancing shoes – whatever your talent is, we'd like you to share it.

### Beautiful surroundings

Both the School of Music and our accommodation venue of University House are set in garden surroundings in a lovely location a short walk from the Canberra CBD and the bus and coach terminal.

### Contribute to the Gaelic community

CGA will be holding its AGM at the Sgoil, which provides an opportunity for you to join in the development of Gaelic in Australia.

The Scottish Gaelic National Spring School or Sgoil Earraich Nàiseanta will be held at the School of Music, William Herbert Place (off Childers Street) Acton, ANU, Canberra from Friday evening 10 September to Sunday afternoon 12 September 2010.

### Accommodation

Accommodation is provided nearby at University House, ANU, cnr Balmain Cres. & Liversedge St, Acton, ACT

### Cost

The cost of tuition, including lunch, morning and afternoon teas and entertainment, is \$230. Twin share accommodation including breakfast for two nights is available at \$150 per person, and it is recommended that participants live-in if possible, since much of the learning happens informally outside class time.

If you pay in full before 5 August there is an early bird discount. The small surcharge for non members gives you a year's membership of CGA at a discount.
